DOCTRINE OF PRAYER

True prayer is a natural result of true salvation. The Holy Spirit's presence enables the believer to talk to the God of the universe and call Him his own Father. Gal. 4:6. Prayer is an instrument provided by God's grace not only to meet the needs of the difficulties, trials, and adversities of life, but also as a means of expressing gratitude, thanksgiving and praise to Him. The latter is called Communion, fellowship, spiritual intercourse. The former is called a petition. Intercession reaches out and includes others. Oft times the question is asked, Does the Lord hear and answer the prayer of an unbeliever? I believe you will be able to correctly answer that question when you see the requirements placed on the prayers of a believer who it would seem rarely has his prayers answered.

PRINCIPLES OF PRAYER

- 8. Prayer is offered and made on the basis of Grace not because we have earned the right to be heard. Heb. 4:16

Under Roman rule there was a practice of selling men and women as slaves. Man is a slave in bondage to sin and Satan - Jn. 8:33, 44 Christ came to the cosmic slave market to pay the purchase price.

Under Old Testament economy three (3) things could be redeemed:

- 1) wife
- 2 slave
- 3) land

Three things necessary lefore one could redeem:

- 1) had to be a near kinsman 2) had to have means 3) had to be willing Jesus Christ qualifies in all three areas as an adequate redeemer.
 - 1) Jesus Christ was our kinsman by Virgin Birth Phil. 2:7&8
 - 2) Jesus Christ was able as the God Man I Tim. 2:5; I Peter 1:18 & 19
 - 3) Jesus Christ was willing Rev. 5:9

Jesus Christ purchased our freedom from the slave market of sin.

MEMORY WORK DOCTRINE OF PRAYER

Prayer is an instrument provided by God's grace, not only to meet the needs in the difficulties, trials, and adversities of life, but also as a means of expressing gratitude, thanksgiving, and praise to God. The Lord Jesus Christ, who would spend entire nights in prayer, is our example. (Read Matt. 14:22,23; Mark 6:46;47; Luke 6:12; John 17.) Below are listed some of the principles of prayer.

EXHORTATIONS TO PRAY.

- Jeremiah 33:3 "Call unto me, and I will answer thee, and shew thee great and mighty things, which thou knowest not."
- Matthew 7:7,8 "Ask, and it shall be given you; seek, and ye shall find; knock, and it shall be opened unto you: For every one that asketh receiveth; and he that seeketh findeth; and to him that knocketh it shall be opened."
- Luke 18:1b "Men ought always to pray, and not to faint."
- Philippians 4:6,7 "Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God which passeth all understanding shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus."

PRAYER IS MADE ON THE BASIS OF GRACE

- Hebrews 4:16 "Let us therefore come boldy unto the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy, and find grace to help in time of need."

PRAYER MUST BE IN COMPLIANCE WITH THE WORD OF GOD

PRAYER MUST BE SUBMITTED ON THE BASIS OF FAITH IN GOD
